

Spreading Awareness for Wildlife Conservation at M.K DAV Public School , Daltonganj

In response to the nationwide call for environmental consciousness initiated under the International Big Cat Alliance (IBCA) Summit 2026 by CBSE, the Institution organised a series of awareness activities aimed at sensitising students to the urgent need for conserving big cats and preserving ecological harmony. The initiative carried forward the Institution's pursuit of shaping young minds that listen to the concerns of nature with awareness and empathy.

The programme commenced with a Big Cat Conservation Pledge during the morning assembly where students collectively voiced their commitment to protecting wildlife and safeguarding natural habitats.
